4. Read vv.3:1-3, was it wise of Eve to have a conversation with the devil? Why or why not?
5. Read vv.3:4-5. Did the serpent tell Eve something that contradicted what God said?
6. Other than what the serpent said, what made the tree God said not to eat from so tempting?
7. Was Eve responsible for Adam eating from the tree God told them not to eat from?
8. What did God tell the serpent, Adam, and Eve for their disobedience?
9. In chapter 4:6-7, why is the conversation the Lord had with Cain important?
10. What did God do when Cain told Him that his punishment was more than he could bear?
11. Where did Cain go after he was driven out of Eden?
12. Who is Seth?

4. In Joshua chapter 2, what part of the land did Joshua send two spies to view?
5. When the king of Jericho sent men to Rahab's house looking for strangers who had come to her house, what did she tell them? Why did she do this?
6. What promises were made between Rahab and the spies?
7. What is important about the red cord?
8. What is the heading (usually in bold print) for Matthew chapter 1?
9. What do you learn about Rahab in Matthew 1:5-6?
10. How does faith without works fit the actions of Rahab? (James 2:25-26)
