Topic: The Benefits of Keeping the Faith

Week 1: What is the Meaning of Faith?

Background Reading:

Guiding Questions:

- 1. How strong is your faith?
- 2. What is the purpose of tests?
- 3. Where does temptation come from?
- 4. What does your anger mean in God's sight?

Week 2: What Is Evidence of Faith?

Background Reading:

- James 2:1-13 (Faith Removes Prejudice)
- James 2: 14-26 (Faith Proves Itself by Good Deeds)
- James 3: 1-12 (Faith Controls the Tongue)

Guiding Questions:

- 1. How does faith remove prejudice?
- 2. How does faith prove itself?
- 3. How does faith control the tongue? Give examples.

Week 3: What Is Evidence of Faith?

Background Reading:

- James 3: 13-18 (Faith Produces Wisdom)
- James 4: 1-12 (Faith Produces Humility)
- James 4: 13-17 (Faith Produces Dependence on God)

Guiding Questions:

- 1. How does faith produce Wisdom?
- 2. How does God feel about the proud?
- 3. How does faith produce dependence on God?

Week 4: Characteristics of Faith

Background Reading:

- James 5: 1-6 (Faith Is Better than Wealth)
- James 5: 7-18 (Faith Endures while Awaiting Christ's Return)
- James 5: 19-20 (Faith Confronts Wandering Believers)
- Matthew 18: 12-14 (Instructions about Faith)

Guiding Questions:

- 1. Which is better faith or wealth?
- 2. Why does faith endure while awaiting Christ's return?
- 3. Why couldn't the disciples cast out that demon?
