Guiding Questions:

- Why did Job want to find God?
- Who is causing Job's suffering ?

**Week 3: Job 32: 1-22; 33: 1-8; 36: 1-10**

Guiding Questions:

- How do you feel about Elihu?
- Does Elihu give Job good advice??

**Week 4: Job 38:1-22;40:1-14; 42:1-17**

Guiding Questions

- Do you think Job was hard on Job? Explain.
- How do you think Job felt about himself after God answered him?

**Week 5: Review and Final Points Discussion**

Guiding Questions

- What lessons have you learned through the study of Job?
- How will you be a friend to others who when they are going through life's difficulties based on your lessons with Job's friends, his wife, and Job's argument?
