Four Weeks (February 6, 13, 20, and 27)**

Study in the Book of Romans: “A Path for All: Hope and Living Righteously”

Week 1: Romans Chapters 1-3

Guiding Questions:

1. Why did Paul write to the Roman Church?
2. Describe what is meant by the Jews circumcision and what Paul says is real circumcision.
3. Explain Paul’s argument that no one can be justified by their own merits or works

Week 2: Romans Chapters 4-8

Guiding Questions:

1. How did Abraham become righteous in God’s eyes?
2. How did Paul explain the significance of baptism to the Roman Church?
3. What does walking in the flesh cost us as opposed to walking and living in the spirit?

Week 3: Romans Chapters 9-13

Guiding Questions:

1. Why does God express sorrow over the stubbornness of the Jews?
2. What does Paul urge the brothers and sisters of Rome, members of God’s body to do?

Week 4: Romans Chapters 1-3

Guiding Questions

1. Elaborate on Paul addressing the church on one’s faith being weak or strong because of what he eats.
2. Describe what Paul’s desire for the Romans would be
